Iowa Voter Survey
Likely Democratic Caucus Attendees
January 23-27, 2020

Overview

This report contains the results of a Civiqs survey of 655 likely Democratic Caucus attendees in lowa from January 23-27, 2020. The survey was conducted online, among selected members of the Civiqs research panel. Sampled individuals were emailed by Civiqs and responded using a personalized link to the survey at civiqs.com.

Likely Democratic Caucus attendees are respondents who answered that they would "Definitely" or "Probably" attend the Iowa Democratic Caucuses scheduled for February 2020, in question 1, and who identified themselves as Democrats or Independents on a previous Civiqs survey.

The survey results are weighted by age, race, gender, education, party identification, and congressional district to be representative of the population of likely lowa Democratic Caucus attendees. Demographic data, including self-reported party identification, was collected in previous Civiqs surveys. The general design effect due to weighting is 1.60. The survey has a margin of error of $\pm 4.8\%$ at the 95% confidence level, accounting for the design effect. All survey results in this report are reported as percentages.
